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## † Our Hopes and Vision

### **We believe in a family-led, Christ-centered approach to catechesis.**

Our faith teaches that *parents are the primary catechists of their children*. Parents teach not only with their words but often, more importantly, with their attitudes and actions.

Saint John Paul II often referred to the family as “**the domestic Church**” because parents provide a child’s first and primary example of faith. Catholicism in the home should be a joyful way of life rather than an obligation. A family-centered approach deepens the role the domestic church plays in the faith formation of each child, providing opportunities for the entire family to learn, pray, and grow in relationship with Christ.

We are happy to partner with you and support you in the mission of forming your children to be dynamic and visible disciples of Jesus Christ in the Catholic Church.

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## † Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Level 1 - Ages 3 - 5

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (“CGS”) is a Montessori-based religious education program. It was derived from the educational philosophy of Dr. Maria Montessori who was a devout Catholic and who dedicated a lifetime to observing the natural development of the child.

As Catholics, we believe that each child has an innate spirituality and a unique relationship with God. In CGS, we give the child a space of his/her own (called “The Atrium”) where he/she is encouraged to foster this relationship through the use of hands-on materials. The child is shown how to “work” (setup and manipulate) the materials. In this way, he/she is not just memorizing information, but truly contemplating the mysteries of our Faith.

### 2021-2022 Schedule and Location

CGS classes meet weekly in the **Parish Office**. You may choose which class day and time works best for your family, subject to availability, as class sizes are capped to 10 students per session to allow for a truly immersive learning experience.

**Sunday Mornings**, 10:30 a.m. until 12:00 p.m.

**Friday Afternoons**, 3:15 until 4:45 p.m.

### Attendance

While attendance at CGS is not mandatory, we strongly encourage consistent and regular participation so that our students may gain the most out of their experience.

### Sacramental Catch Up

## † First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion Sacrament Preparation - Grades 1 and 2

Our parish requires a two-year preparation period for all Sacraments. Preparation for First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion generally occurs in first and second grade. Year one preparation is for first grade students in non-Catholic school and year two is for second grade students in both Catholic school and non-Catholic school. Please contact T.J. to arrange for preparation if your child is in a different grade.

### Non-Catholic School Students

Parents guide their children in at-home study for 30–45 minutes a week. A complete curriculum is provided to each family. A catechist is available to answer your questions and can provide guidance and ideas in making this special time with your children enriching. The catechist will provide a schedule of weekly assignments to help your child progress through the preparation.

Once per month, the student and at least one parent are required to attend an in-person, large group session. During the session, the catechist will lead the class in discussion, activities, and other enrichment opportunities to further illustrate and bring to life the topics studied at home.

Providing flexibility for instruction in the home with fewer class sessions is intended to reduce the burden on busy families for whom weekly classes can become more a burden than a joy.

### Requirements for Non-Catholic School Students

- **Weekly Assignments:** All assessments and chapter tests from the weekly at-home assignments must be submitted at the monthly in-person session. Failure to complete or submit any more than three of the assessments on time will result in the need for the student to repeat the year.
- **Large Group Sessions:** Students and at least one parent are required to attend the monthly in-person sessions. A maximum of two absences is allowed per year for any reason. More than two absences will result in the need for the student to repeat the year.
  - Missed classes due to travel, vacation, sports, and/or extracurricular activities, even with advanced notice are not considered excused and are applied to the two allowed absences.

- Arrival more than 5 minutes late is marked as tardy. Three tardies equal one absence. If you arrive more than 15 minutes late, you are considered absent.
  - Children are required to attend the Empowering God's Children: Teaching Safety course offered by the Diocese on **September 19 at 12:15 p.m.** Parents may opt their child out of the class by completing a waiver form located on the parish website. Not attending this class **with a completed opt-out form** is not counted among the two absences.
  - In the event of a prolonged illness, please contact T.J. Cofield.
- **Rehearsal (Year 2 Only):** Rehearsal is mandatory for all year 2 students and at least one parent. The rehearsal is scheduled for **Sunday, May 1, 2022 at 12:15 p.m.**

## Catholic School Students

**Students receive the sacraments of First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion in their parish and not in the school they attend.** Since much of the catechetical preparation is done in religion classes while in school, second grade students who attend Catholic schools are required to meet in the large group sessions noted above four times during the year - **September 12, November 14, January 9, and March 13.**

## Requirements for Catholic School Students

- **Large Group Sessions:** Catholic School students and at least one parent must attend four large group sessions where the catechist will lead the class in discussion, activities, and other enrichment opportunities to deepen the preparation. Only one absence is allowed due to the limited number of sessions. More than one absence will result in the need for the student to repeat the year.
  - Missed classes due to travel, vacation, sports, and/or extracurricular activities, even with advanced notice, are not considered excused and are applied to the one allowed absence.
  - Arrival more than 5 minutes late is marked as tardy. Three tardies equal one absence. If you arrive more than 15 minutes late, you are considered absent.
  - In the event of a prolonged illness, please contact T.J. Cofield.
- **Rehearsal:** Rehearsal is mandatory for all Year 2 students and at least one parent. The rehearsal is scheduled for **Sunday, May 1, 2022 at 12:15 p.m.**

## † Clare's Kids - Grades 3 - 5

Clare's Kids exists to create a place of community and faith for elementary school students at Saint Clare of Assisi Parish. Clare's Kids is:

- **Open to students in both Catholic and Non-Catholic schools.**
- **Family-led and Christ-centered!** Children enrolled will be provided at-home faith enrichment and learning opportunities to do as a family.
- **Engaging & dynamic!** Clare's Kids sessions include worship, games, music, prayer, fellowship, fun, and service.
- **A balance of at-home and in-person catechesis.** Monthly large-group sessions to discuss and expand upon the topics in the curriculum,

For 2021-2022, Clare's Kids will feature some new elements to encourage students to live out their faith in their everyday lives, and to encourage one another to do the same! If your child wants to be part of a team, become the best version of themselves, and help others to do the same, Clare's Kids is the place for them!

### 2021-2022 Schedule and Location

All Clare's Kids Large Group Sessions are held at **Bishop England High School** on the second Sunday of the month from 12:15 to 1:45 p.m.. Lunch will be provided, however your child is welcome to bring their own.

### Attendance

While attendance at Clare's Kids is not mandatory, regular attendance at the large group sessions is encouraged so that the students may develop deeper relationships with each other and with Jesus, knowing that they are a member of the body of Christ.

## General Policies for Faith Formation Programs

### † Registration

Registration forms are available at [clare.church](http://clare.church). Payment is due at the time of registration and can be paid online. Baptismal certificates must be on file in the parish office for every child enrolled in Faith Formation. If you have not yet submitted a copy of the certificate, there is a place to upload on the registration form.

### † Attendance

*Mass: Keep holy the Sabbath.*

Participation in Sunday Mass and on Holy Days is a fundamental and necessary factor in deepening your child's faith and equipping him/her for discipleship. Parents who sign up their children in our Faith Formation programs commit to living this out as a family, just as they promised God at their child's baptism.

### † Class Arrival and Dismissal

Your children's safety is of the utmost concern to us.

- Parents or designated person(s) must sign students in and out.
- Children will be released only to a parent/guardian or a designated person.
- Please be on time to pick up your children at the end of class. Do not pick your child up before the children are released at the end of class.
- Instructions for entry to the BEHS classrooms will be distributed after registration.

## † Communications and Emergency Closings

We use email to communicate important updates. Please check your email's spam folder if you are not receiving our parish bulletin or Faith Formation emails. If we need to cancel Faith Formation classes or Youth Ministry activities for any reason, we will send out an email. We will provide a number for you to call in the case of any emergency during class or large group session times.

## † Cell Phones

Cell phone use in the large group sessions and rehearsal is not allowed. Students in our Clare's Kids program are expected to use their cell phones responsibly and respectfully. If the phone becomes a distraction, it will be kept by an adult volunteer and returned at the end of the session.

Any use of social media that speaks negatively about another student, an adult leader, our programs, or our Church could result in disciplinary action. However, we highly encourage our students to use social media as a platform to share their faith and God's love with others.

## † Empowering God's Children: Teaching Safety

Every parish in the Diocese of Charleston is required to offer a class on "Empowering God's Children: Teaching Safety" each year to all students. If parents would like to opt out their child from this class, they must complete the [opt-out form online](#) with their registration.

## † Expectations of Behavior

In the spirit of love and charity toward one another, and growth in self-discipline, we expect the following from our students:

- Students will be respectful of themselves and others, especially adults. The use of "Yes, Ma'am," "No, Ma'am," "Yes, Sir/Father," and "No, Sir/Father" is expected when speaking to all adults.
- Students will respect the rights of other students to learn and the catechist's responsibility to teach.
- Students will engage and contribute in a positive manner to the learning environment.
- Students will follow the overall class procedures.

If a student displays conduct disruptive to Faith Formation volunteers or another student, the catechist will give the student the opportunity to change the unacceptable behavior. If the unacceptable behavior continues, the student will be asked to confer with the catechist and parents after class.

If the unacceptable behavior persists, the parents will be notified of the need for a conference with the Director of Child Formation and/or the Pastor. Should the unacceptable behavior continue after the conference, the Director of Child Formation and the Pastor may consider expulsion from the program.

## † Attire

Students are to maintain a modest appearance. This appearance may be casual, but respectful. No one is to wear short shorts nor revealing shirts. Appropriateness of attire will be determined by an adult leader in consultation with the Director of Child Formation.

## † Special Child Custody Situations

**It is the responsibility of the custodial parent** to provide copies or documents to the parish office related to child custody and restraining orders, if applicable, and to personally make the Director of Child Formation aware of any unique concerns.

## † Special Needs & Learning Disabilities

Please share with us if your child has a learning disability or special need so we can best help your child learn while they are in our Faith Formation programs. Please feel free to arrange a meeting with T.J. Cofield to discuss how we can help your child excel in their Faith Formation class.

## † Role of the Parents in Child Formation

**It is your moral obligation** for you and your family to participate in Sunday Mass every weekend and in the Holy Days of Obligation, to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation at least once a year (for those who are in full communion with the Church), and to engage in your child(ren)'s faith formation programs.

**Parents should be good stewards of this parish.** Recognizing that everything we have comes from God, parents model by their actions and attitudes a sense of joy and charity, and share their God-given gifts of time, talent, and treasure with the parish community and the community at large. Children will naturally learn to emulate the good example of stewardship put forth by their parents.

We want to partner with you and support you in this mission you have taken on in bringing up your children in the faith. All that we offer in Child Formation is focused on this goal.

## † Service Opportunities for Parents

Opportunities for volunteering, both in and out of the classroom, are offered each year. Opportunities are listed on the Registration Form. Please contact the Director of Child Formation for more information on any of the opportunities and the time commitment involved.

**All adults working with children in our Faith Formation programs MUST have Safe Environment screenings on file with the Parish Office.**
