

Outdoor Mass will be celebrated at 9:00 a.m. on Sundays in the grassy area next to the track at BEHS.

Everyone who attends Mass in person is **strongly encouraged** to wear a mask they are to bring. There will no supply of masks at Mass.

Everyone, please bring your own lawn chair or blanket for seating. There will be no seats available for borrowing.

Ideally, the first to arrive should place their chairs in the first row and then fill in the remaining space keeping 6 feet of distance between families. Only members of the same household address may have their chairs next to one another.

The Nursery is available in the area near the BE Commons entrance. Children's Liturgy of the Word is currently suspended.

There will be no passing of baskets for the offertory collection. One basket will be positioned for the collection of offerings. Please give online!

The offertory procession of bread, wine, and financial gifts has been eliminated.

The Sign of Peace has been eliminated.

Holy Communion will be distributed during the usual course of the Mass. Only the Sacred Host will be distributed. Personnel will direct communicants to come forward SINGLE FILE, six feet apart, everyone should have on their masks.

Clergy and ministers will distribute Holy Communion in the hand only. Communicants must extend their arms FULL LENGTH to receive the Sacred Host. Please keep your mask on when receiving in the hand, step to the side, lower your mask and consume the Host.

Please no socializing or gathering after Mass.

Public restrooms will NOT be available.

Being outdoors, we will be subjected to the weather. If it is raining or if the forecast calls for the likelihood of rain, outdoor Mass will be cancelled. We will alert the parish via email, social media and our website.

We no longer offer a "drive in" option since we are not live streaming the 9:00 a.m. Mass. Please park near the Mass area and join us. You may sit in your car, but please do not have your car engine running.

Clearly, there are many restrictions and segues from our usual way of celebrating the Mass. These unusual times call for unusual measures. All of us must undertake the responsibility for promoting and ensuring a healthy and safe environment. We will work together as a family and as a team to do so.
