

Dei Verbum 12

- Content and unity of the whole Scripture
- Living Tradition of the whole Church
- Coherence of the whole of the faith within itself and within the whole plan of Revelation



Literal Sense

- Meaning author intended to convey
- All other senses depend on the literal sense
- Isaiah 5:1-7

Spiritual Senses

Allegorical (Typological) Sense

- Understanding all Scripture in light of Christ
- 1 Corinthians 10:1-4
- Allegorical reading of Isaiah 5:1-7?

Moral Sense

- Instruction for right living
- 1 Corinthians 10:6-11
- Moral reading of Isaiah5:1-7?

Eschatological (Anagogical) Sense

- "Anagogical" from Greek for "leading" or "ascent"
- Understanding Scripture and our lived experience in light of our final end
- Also in light of the Church, the new Jerusalem
- Eschatological reading of Isaiah 5:1-7
